Introduction

The wedding industry is a growing market, with an annual average of almost \$72 billion spent on weddings in the U.S. alone. Nearly 2.3 million couples get married every year in the United States, and a typical couple allocates about \$20,000 for the wedding expenses. A lot of vendors benefit from this booming industry, and that would include wedding planners - sometimes known as bridal consultants or wedding coordinators.

Decades ago, ceremonies were just simple affairs, mostly taken care of by family members and friends. But nowadays, most couples who are getting married are working full time, thus, wedding planners have become an essential part of the wedding preparations and ceremony. The demand for wedding planners is increasing every year, not least because they have proven to be very successful in making dream weddings come true – without a sweat from the brides and grooms to be!

Although hiring a wedding planner comes with a significant cost, most couples who hired a good quality wedding planner thought it was the greatest decision they had ever made and well worth every single dime spent - no price can be tagged for the peace of mind and time saved during the wedding preparation period. After all, it is your special, once-in-a-lifetime day, and everything needs to be perfect. Indeed, wedding planners will be part of more weddings to come, as the industry seems to grow bigger and bigger each year.

The challenge for engaged couples is how to go about choosing a skilled wedding planner that would suit their budget. There are thousands of professional wedding planners these days and so it is a tough decision whom to select. Numerous resources are available for those who have no idea at all where to start, and it would be best to check out all the information before making that pick. At the very least, know what to expect from the wedding planners, the expected costs and types of services, and tips on how to search for the best one for you.

Who Needs a Wedding Planner

There are some couples who have the luxury of time to prepare for their wedding day, and therefore won't have any need to hire a wedding planner, but for the most part, people have jobs to worry about and many other commitments that make adequately preparing for their wedding almost impossible.

- A couple intending to have a destination wedding
- A couple who wish to invite more than 200 guests
- A couple with very few family members and friends who can help
- A couple who doesn't know many vendors who often finds negotiating with such people tiresome
- A couple who would appreciate sound advice from a qualified professional
- A couple who doesn't want to miss out any minute details of the preparation

What to Expect from a Wedding Planner

Wedding planners are invaluable aids when it comes to planning your big day. Their main function is to coordinate everything involved in the process of planning your wedding. Some of the tasks that you can expect them to deliver would include the following:

- Help in theme planning and budgeting
- Source out and negotiate with vendors
- Remind couples about due dates
- Assist in sending out invitations and keep track of your guest list
- Attend tastings and selections of the menu
- Find the perfect photographer and videographer
- Order flowers and suggest arrangements aligned with the wedding's theme
- Scout musicians / singers / DJ's/ hosts and check out gigs before selecting the best performers to suit your theme
- Help the bride decide on the design of the wedding gown and bridesmaid's dresses
- Assist with the rehearsals and rehearsal dinner
- Create the program for the reception
- Select songs to be played in the church and reception area

Wedding planners can practically do everything there is to do - that is if you hire a full service wedding planner. Some wedding planners are partial-event planners only and so the services would vary depending on the requirements of the couple. What is important is that you can count on them to do the things you believe you are not capable of, or good at, or simply don't have the time to do.

On top of making sure all the things needed are in place, you can rely on them to be calm at anytime during the wedding and be very organized. During frantic and busy planning moments, wedding planners can be a good outsiders who can give sound judgements in any situation. They are street-smart and great problem solvers. On the day of the wedding, they ensure that everyone – the bride, groom, family, entourage, officials and vendors are in their proper places at the right time. When a mishap will occur, you can trust in a great wedding planner to resolve it quietly and quickly.

The Pros of Using a Wedding Planner

There are various advantages if you hire a wedding planner, and these would include:

1. Wedding planners are the best negotiators and they can usually get the best deals from most vendors.
2. Wedding planners are very experienced and have many exceptional ideas.
3. Wedding planners are very creative and can make your wedding distinct from the usual wedding ceremonies.
4. Wedding planners are great when it comes to budgeting and can help you best manage your resources.

How to Search for the Best Wedding Planner

Types of Wedding Planners

There are numerous ways to work out who is the wedding planner best suited for your wedding, but the first step is to understand the different kinds of wedding planners available. Once you differentiate between them, you can then decide what type of wedding planner you would like to partner with. The four categories of wedding planners are:

1. Wedding Consultant – someone who can give input on pointers from start of preparation, to vendors that can fit the budget. Meanwhile, the couple will be responsible for planning and executing everything.
2. Wedding Day Director – someone who will oversee everything on the day of the wedding only; the couple will need to do all the planning.
3. Commissioned Wedding Planners – free wedding assistance but the couple can only select from the accredited vendors of the group; these wedding planners earn through commissions from the suppliers.
4. Wedding Coordinator – someone who does all the work and offers a complete wedding planning service - from planning to organizing; makes budget proposals and goes with the couple to select vendors; directs the day of the wedding and ensures that everything is running smoothly.

Once you know your requirements and the type of planner you want to hire, the next step is look for that perfect wedding planner. Interviewing the Wedding Planner

As soon as you have shortlisted around 3 to 5 wedding planners, the next step is to interview them. You have to set up interviews and as much as possible, visit them in their office, so you'll have an idea of their working environment. Your interview should be like that of a job interview, as you are technically hiring them to do a job for you.

Before the interview, make sure you have thoroughly checked out the references from past couples they have worked with. Also, you should try to make sure you have some of the basic details finalized, like the target date for your wedding, how many guests to invite, overall budget, and the overall vision, if you have any.

If you don't, this is okay as it is the wedding planner's job to help you with this. Once you start talking with them, feel their attitude and see if you click with them. It's very important that your wedding planner is someone that both the bride and groom connect with. Ask about their prices, services, typical wedding plans, and get references if you don't already have any yet.

Successful professional wedding planners will be more than willing to give you a list of clients they have worked for in the past. After the interview, decide if you feel you have made a good connection with them, and decide if you think you can trust them to work with your budget. If you already have a vision, verify if they understood it.

Sometimes you have to go with your intuition. If they don't feel right, then don't pursue it. You will be working with this wedding planner for the whole of the time that you prepare your wedding, and so it is vital that you choose someone that you are going to be able to work well with.

“Must Ask Questions” During Interview With The Wedding Planner

Here are examples of questions you must ask during the interview:

A. Knowing the Planner

- Why are you in this business? How and when did you start planning weddings?
- Are you a certified wedding planner or member of any association? What is your educational background?
- How long have you been in the business and how many weddings have you planned previously? Can you briefly describe the best wedding you have planned so far?
- Is wedding planning your full time job? How much time do you devote to this job? How many clients do you have each month?
- How would you rate your problem-solving skills? Can you tell me about the most challenging wedding you’ve planned before, and how you handled it?

B. Knowledge of Venue

- Do you know the venue we like? Have you worked there before?
- Was there ever a time when bad weather conditions ruined your wedding plans? What contingency plans do you have in case the weather causes problems?

C. Vendor Management

- Do you get commissions or discounts from any of the vendors you refer? How do handle the payment of vendors?
- Can we get our own vendors in case we don’t like your referrals, or are we required to book the vendors that are only in your list?
- Will you attend all the meetings with vendors alongside us? Will you assist us in reviewing the contracts with each vendor?

D. Scope of Work

- What type of planning do you offer? What are the different packages that you have? Do you customize it based on what we want, or do you have standard packages already?
- What are the extra things that you can do? What do you expect us to do?

- How many staff will be working with us during the wedding preparation and on the actual day of the wedding?
- What are the specific inclusions of the package? How many phone calls and meetings are you going to have with us? How much time will you spend with us, especially on our wedding day? Will you leave after all the vendors leave?

E. Closing the Deal

- Once we decide to use your services, when can we expect to sign the contract that includes your rates, services, and payment policies? If we have changes with the plan, would you be willing to amend the contract later on? How soon can you revise things?
- Do you have refund or cancellation policies?
- Do you provide services that include extra charges not listed in the contract that we should know about beforehand?
- If we give you our budget, how quickly can you submit a budget proposal?

What is the Cost of Hiring a Wedding Planner

One of the most important things to consider in hiring a wedding planner is the cost involved. Wedding planners can charge in various ways, such as taking a percentage of the total cost of the wedding, an hourly rate, or a flat rate. The couple must make sure they read the contract very carefully and understand the payment terms and what is covered. To give you an idea of the usual costs, here's a summary:

1. Percentage of the total budget – This is commonly charged if the wedding planner is in charge of everything and the wedding's budget is \$30,000 or more. Typical fees range from 10 to 15% of the total budget.
2. Hourly rate – Based on Payscale.com, the average fee per hour is \$9.74 to \$21.72.
3. Flat rate – This is more applicable to those not taking care of all the details. Usually, specific services are agreed between the couple and the planner, and cost would depend on the type of services needed.

For more information about costs, here's a more detailed examples of average fees charged per specific services:

1. \$1,500 a day – wedding planner will come up with a wedding timeline, refer vendors, and facilitate the wedding day.
2. \$3,700 - wedding planner will act as consultant for planning and handle the day of the wedding; but couple will do all the pre-wedding preparations
3. \$5,000 – wedding planner will give full service; take charge of most wedding details, oversee the wedding day
4. \$10,000 – almost the same as those in the \$5,000 range but any wedding planner charging these rates would likely be in-demand and famous, with more than 10 years of experience

The costs of course would also vary depending on your location. For instance, the average cost for a wedding consultant in the northeast is \$3,636, while in the south, it is much less, about \$2,635. The national average wedding planner fee is, according to the Association of Bridal Consultants, about \$3,262.

Take note of the inclusions per package as outlined below:

1. A day package – wedding planner will help the couple with a wedding day plan; negotiate with vendors; deal with wedding details from start to end.
2. A consulting package - wedding planner suggests vendors, venues, color themes, and other small details; will also give advice on how to keep planning on track; will be present on the wedding day to interact with vendors and ensure the day is smooth but will not do any physical legwork.
3. A full service package – wedding planner will look for venue, recommend vendors and accompany couples in negotiating with them; send invitations and monitor RSVP's; go with couples to food tastings; supervise the wedding day and direct the overall program.

Packages and services would entirely differ between different wedding planners, and so it is vital to have a clear agreement put into writing to avoid misunderstandings. This will also prevent couples from feeling that they had been ripped-off if charges are communicated from time to time. Additional costs may also be expected, like the tip for the wedding planner, which is usually about 15% for superb services. However, instead of cash, couples mostly give gift vouchers as a tip.

Tips on How to Cut Down Costs With Wedding Planners

1. Get information from the internet about tips in reducing costs and guides for useful planning. Some popular websites, like TheKnot.com, provide a 12-month checklist. You might want to discuss with your wedding planner things you think can lower costs.
2. Websites such as Half.com have used books on wedding planning for sale, and it might prove useful to source out all the information you can get. You cannot solely rely on your wedding planner for every single thing, and you can often gain valuable inputs from other sources on how to reduce costs for weddings.
3. Brides-to-be can hook up with other brides through chat boards and trade-off information about services they have found. This may be risky as they are not professionals, but sometimes it can save money if you get good referrals. You can try to suggest these new vendors to your planner if you think that the planner's vendors are charging way too high.
4. Wedding planners normally receive discounts from vendors and pass it on to the clients. You have to be careful to get a planner who is concerned about your financial issues.
5. You might consider getting married in January or February, as these are slow months and wedding planners commonly give discounts as high as 10% during these periods.
6. Get a copy of the local bridal publications, because wedding planners usually advertise in these magazines and you might just get lucky if you find a good wedding planner offering promos and attractive deals.
7. If your budget is really stretched, hire a wedding planner who asks for a flat rate or a percentage of your budget, so you can be assured you won't go overboard. Those charging per hour may have the tendency to extend work and overcharge you.
8. Bargain with your wedding planner if you're really running tight with your budget. Many of them are willing to provide discounts, especially if you can make a good impression with them.
9. You can get the help of your pastor and ask for wedding planners assigned to the church. Most planners who are members of the church are soft hearted and can agree to work on smaller budgets. Some won't even charge you, but if this is the case, you should at least offer some form of payment.

10. Sign up to online bridal pages, bridal fairs, magazines and wedding dress shop bulletins. Prizes from these competitions are often times amazing honeymoon packages and such. If you get lucky, you can save on one area and add the savings to your wedding planner's budget.
11. If you can't afford to have a wedding planner, then ask a family member or a close friend to do it for you. For sure you can find someone who would be willing to do it for you as a gift.

What are the Common Misconceptions about Wedding Planners

Some myths prevent couples from hiring wedding planners. To give you an idea of the common misconceptions, read through the following:

1. Wedding Planners Will Entail a Big Budget

This is not so true as most planners will work with any budget. Planners are not only there for the rich and famous. You might get surprised how much you can actually save if you hire a wedding planner, as they can get the best deals out of wedding vendors.

2. Your Wedding Planner Will Control Everything

Wedding planners normally just get your ideas and improve on them if needed. They usually give options that are within your budget and it is entirely up to you to decide on the major details. Instead of taking control of everything, wedding planners should be seen as experienced hands which you can bounce ideas off of.

3. Most Venues Have Onsite Wedding Planners

It is true that most venues have in-house coordinators, but take note that they are working for the best interests of the venue rather than you. They may be useful in some ways, but not all details of your wedding will be included in their scope of work.

4. Caterers Are Also Capable of Planning Weddings

Caterers have no expertise with wedding planning, though they may be able to do some of the coordinating jobs out of experience. Remember that wedding planners are professionals who are trained and accredited by recognized associations. It is risky if you trust your special day with anyone not qualified to do so.

5. The Venue Has a List of Preferred Vendors – There's No Need For Planners

Most vendors listed are basically there because they paid off some fees or the venue gets a commission once they are booked. Being listed does not guarantee that these vendors are the best in their fields. It is still better to trust the judgement of professional wedding planners, who have vast experience in dealing with different types of vendors.

6. Wedding Planners Get Kickbacks From Vendors

Unless your planner is a commissioned wedding planner, then you don't have to worry about kickbacks from suppliers. Professional wedding planners are mostly transparent with their transactions and go with you to meetings with vendors. It is the interest of the planners to make your event perfect, thus they choose the best vendors that you can afford.

7. The Church Has a Wedding Coordinator – Planners Are Not Necessary

Coordinators in churches are really only experienced with the things that happen in the church, like the flower arrangements inside, and the walking of the bride along the aisle. They are not concerned with the entire planning and you may end up missing out important details if you rely solely on this type of planner. They won't bother to get their hands into anything that takes place outside the church.

8. Vendors Are Listed inside the Yellow Pages – Why Pay for a Planner

Every vendor will be listed within the yellow pages and there's no way for you to know who is the best among them all. Unless you have the time to research, then you can source out all the vendors you need. Wedding planners are experienced in transacting with vendors and they are familiar with the quality of services that different vendors offer.

9. Using the Same Vendors as What My Friends Used is Practical

It is your choice to use whatever vendor your friends used, but are you going to be contented to have a copycat wedding? It is a once in a lifetime event and having a unique and memorable wedding is what every bride-to-be dreams about, and something that professional wedding planners can provide best of all.

10. My Parents Can Do A Great Job and Have All the Time to Help Me

Your parents may dedicate all their time and efforts but you need to consider how valuable their inputs really are. Wedding planners can work with your parents as a guide and can relieve them from the stress of wedding preparation - especially on your wedding day. On your big day, your parents are there to enjoy the occasion as much as you are, and can definitely benefit from a planner who will ensure that everything is running smoothly on the big day.

How to Ensure a Perfect Working Relationship With Your Wedding Planner

Hiring a wedding planner is almost like marrying someone. You are going to trust this planner with the most important day in your life and so you definitely need to establish a good working relationship with them. You are going to spend quite some time with them, as they will be your partner from the start of preparations until the wedding reception is over. It is extremely important that you bring out the best in your planner. To enjoy a perfect relationship with your planner, here are some tips:

- Treat your planners as family. The more comfortable you can be around them, the better your communication. If you establish a special bond with your planner, you can suppose they would give special services to you as well. A great working relationship can be expected so long as you don't just treat them as your employees.
- Avoid losing your temper if things are not going well. Take a moment to cool off before confronting your planner. Sometimes misunderstandings happen. It is also the case that when last minute preparations are made, many people tend to panic. Wedding planners are under a lot of pressure, and we must remember they are just humans who commit mistakes. Be patient but communicate openly in a friendly way what issues you are concerned about. Find a resolution right away and agree with your planner on how to proceed with the wedding preparations.
- Don't suppose that your wedding planner doesn't care about you and is only there because you are paying them to be there. Wedding planners are creative people who are usually very passionate about their work. It is not just a job for most wedding planners - they are there because they enjoy what they're doing. They are the dreamers and believers that fairy tales really do come true. So trust in them and maximize their talents.
- Don't change your mind as often as you change your clothes. Most problems arise when couples are indecisive and keep demanding modifications. Wedding planners may do their best to keep up with your requirements but consider also the time and work it would take if you alter your plans constantly. Do not expect them to be some kind of super-wedding planner who can do anything.
- Give your wedding planners some breathing space. You didn't hire them for nothing. You don't need to poke your nose into every little detail that they are expected to take

care of. It would be irritating for the wedding planner if you show them how obsessive compulsive you can be.

- Wedding planners usually come across “bridezillas”. Hopefully you are not going to be one of those brides! The last thing you need to be on your wedding day is to be overly stressed and losing control. Relax and ask the help of your family members if you think the planner is not doing a good job. It is your special day and you have to be beautiful and gracious at all times.
- Treat your planner professionally. Remember they are professional organizers and should be treated with due respect. Yes you are paying them for their services, but that doesn't give you the reason to treat them with disrespect.

Controlling Your Wedding Planner

Sometimes your wedding planner can get way out of hand with the budget and the execution of your vision. Here are helpful tips on how to control them:

1. Clearly define your vision and check how the wedding planner is responding to your wish list. You need to ensure they understand what you want, and that they are working on it as you like it.
2. As much as possible, settle for a flat fee. The pitfall with the percentage scheme is that some planners may tend to jack up the total wedding cost to get more money. It is important you hire someone you can trust.
3. Pick out the vendors you want to use and do not allow them to make the decision. Take note that it is still you who makes the final decision and that they are just there to guide you. Be firm about your preferences and insist that they honor your choices.
4. Make sure you document all your agreements. A contract should be in place and it should straighten out the smallest details about the resources, timelines, and budget.
5. Communicate constantly and if possible agree on regular meetings. Wedding planners have other clients, and may not prioritize your wedding. Just make sure you always get updated.
6. Ask someone - a close friend perhaps - to keep an eye on your wedding planner on the day of the wedding. It is a must that planners stay courteous and stick to the program schedule. Ensure that the planner is on top of the situation and that he/she is fully capable of handling any unpleasant incidents.

When to Know if You Need to Fire Your Wedding Planner

Wedding planners should follow certain proper etiquette when dealing with clients and vendors. The planner, being the point person for the wedding, is expected to conduct business with the right procedures and methods, and must have the necessary decorum and grace at all times. Given the different functions of a wedding planner, it is necessary that they carry out the tasks you agreed with them.

When they deal with clients, the desires of the customer should be above their own needs and interests. When working with vendors, the wedding planner should not hide any information that would make the couple think that they are in for something that would benefit them more than the client. Proper introductions should be made between the vendor and the couple, and

the wedding planner should provide all the contact details. On the day of the wedding, the planner must be dressed accordingly as well.

As much as you trust your wedding planner, there are times when things get ugly and have to take the decision to replace your wedding planner. Here are some reasons that should prompt you to look for a new wedding planner:

1. You No Longer Trust Your Wedding Planner

When your planner is frequently postponing your appointments and not returning your calls, then it is most likely that your planner has other important things to do. At times, you may also feel your planner is not being truly honest with you. Once you sense that the planner's intentions are questionable, then it's definitely time to let go.

Unacceptable behavior should never be tolerated, as you are trusting your biggest day into his/her hands. If you are not assured that he/she has the necessary time to prepare and the required sincerity to help you, then you have to think about finding a new planner.

2. New Charges Often Come Up

If agreed costs are not followed in many instances, then it should send you a warning that you might be in for more surprises. The budget you initially set should be strictly followed, with just minimal room for changes if deemed necessary. If you notice spending is going out of control, then it should give you enough of a reason to find a more reliable planner.

3. You End Up Baby-Sitting Your Planner

Wedding planners are hired to take away your stress and lighten your burden in planning your wedding. If you end up always telling your planner what's best to do, to the point of making you insane, then don't waste any more time with that wedding planner.

4. Overpricing of Services

Some wedding planners may try to bully you with charges because they say they are more experienced than other available wedding planners. If you have hired an experienced wedding planner who keeps on charging you more than the average costs of things, then you have to rethink continuing your contract. You might end up paying more than the agreed rates and go over your budget, and this is clearly not something an 'experienced' wedding planner should allow to happen.
